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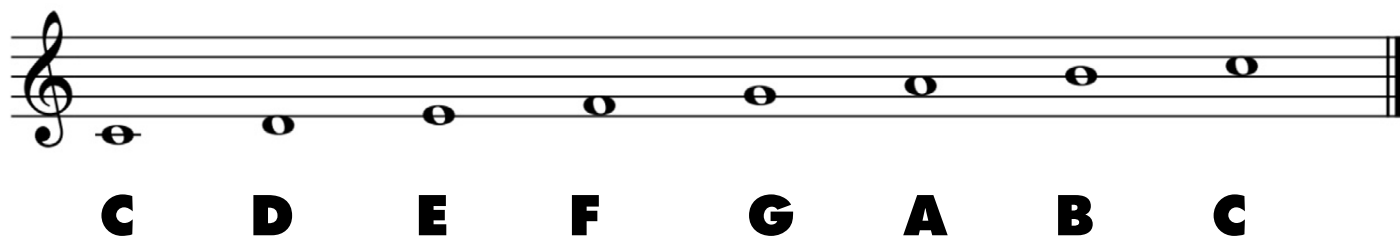
Building Blocks MOZART Sonata in D Major, K. 284, Mvt 1

MUSICAL ALPHABET



In this episode, Buddy shows us different musical building blocks that composers use to “build” a piece of music.

Music notes, or pitches, are called by letter names. All music is composed using these seven letters, which repeat themselves all up and down the keyboard. The notes are written on the **staff**, a set of five lines and four spaces.



A **chord** is when three or more notes are played at the same time. Which notes make up the first chord Buddy plays? Circle them below.

Can you write this chord on the staff? The first note (A) is already written for you. Write the notes above the first note, so that the three notes are stacked on top of one another.
