WHAT DO YOU HEAR?



In this episode we meet Brian Perry and his instrument, the double bass. To demonstrate his instrument's low sound, he and Buddy play a piece where the bass pretends to be an elephant!

Before you listen, describe what you know about elephants. Based on what you know, what do you think music that represents elephants should sound like?
