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

# WHAT IS RHYTHM?



Music has short and long sounds, just like you heard in the video. All of these short and long sounds must have a **steady beat**, like your heartbeat! The combination of short and long sounds with a steady beat creates a pattern, which we call **rhythm**.

Here are some notes that make short and long sounds.




This note is called a **quarter note**; we use **ta** to count this. Each quarter note gets **ONE** beat.



This note value is **two eighth notes**; we use **ti-ti** to count this. Two eighth notes equal **ONE** beat.


Color the apples for the number of beats each example represents.






## CLIBURN KIDS
