How Many Hands: Racing Donkeys SAINT-SAËNS "Wild Donkeys" from Carnival of the Animals

MUSICAL MATCHING - TEMPO

The wild donkeys our composer wrote about are from Tibet, which is located in the southwest region of China. They are known for being able to run very fast!

Buddy explains that the two pianists playing the same notes together depict the two wild donkeys

MUSICAL MATCHING
